6A Girls Section Wrestling - Bertha-Hewitt- Verndale -Parkers Prairie

Kristin Grewe (2-2) 112 - DNP

Kristin found her "FEISTY" this weekend at the section 6A girls wrestling event. She faced off against the number three seed Shauna Geiser from NYM in the first round and was defeated. Geiser would end up second in the event and earn a trip to the MSHSL state tourney. Grewe bounced back with two great wins by fall. Grewe was "Feisty" throughout the tourney with constant attacks in all positions. Early this season, she was playing defense most of the time. Then mid-year she would show a burst of "Feisty" but fade away. In this tournament, she was "Feisty" the entire time with a determination to persevere. WOW, what FUN!

Veya McManigle (2-2) 118 - DNP

Veya would open the tourney with a fall over [Anastasia Smith](#) from Spectrum. She would then drop a match to [Kaylee Endres](#) of WDC (Endres would finish the tourney in 2nd, earning a trip to the MSHSL state meet. McManigle would bounce back with a win by fall over Chloe Bliss of SRR. Then in the "Blood Round," Veya would have to injure default due to a concussion. Veya battled injury all season and was able to bounce back just in time to wrestle in the section meet. She gave it her all in the toughest weight class in the tourney, which included 15 competitors.

Autumn Becker (1-2) 124 - DNP

Autumn was in the second deepest weight in the tournament with 14 athletes and many records that were 75% or better. Becker would lose to [Cora Rand](#) from Big Lake, who was the 3 seed. She would then defeat a Shakopee foe by fall. An unfortunate draw would then place her against senior Olivia Gardas, who was a state entrant last year. Autumn would lose this one and get knocked out of the tourney. Becker has made great strides this season. She loves to compete and battle it out in the center circle, she loves the intensity and brings a ton of spirit to the practice room and the events.

Chloe Twardowski (0-2) 130 - DNP

Chloe was late to the game but is very excited to be on the mat. She has made a lot of progress in a short time, and this weekend she gave her best performance yet. She battled hard in all positions, but the lack of knowledge was just too much. Her constant smile on and off the mat is a burst of energy for her teammates. The coaching staff is excited for her future and ready to watch her grow in the great sport of wrestling.

Annabelle Koehn (0-2) 142 - DNP

Annabelle received a tough draw in the section 6 event. She battled hard and gave a great job with hand control and positioning but lost her first match by decision. Her second match was against a more experienced foe and that foe would end her season. Annabelle stepped up to the challenge as a 7th grader to compete in the section 6A tourney.

Chloe Black (2-2) 136 - DNP (0 pts)

Chloe pinned her first opponent, Ella Mickelson from WCAA. She would drop her second match to Addison Hillukka from WDC. She would then pick up a medical forfeit to move to the "Blood Round". Black got caught in a tough position and would drop her match, and an opportunity to place at the section meet. Chloe Black has been super consistent all season long and has been a cornerstone for the girls' program this season. She battled injury these last two weeks, fighting the pain as she wanted to see the mats at the section 6A event. What a "GRITTY" performance by Chloe Black down the stretch.

Elora Wagner (2-0) 148 - 1st

Elora Wagner started the event with the #1 seed and a 32-2 record. She would prove the seeding true with two first-period pins in dominant fashion in the semis and finals. The first match over Khloe Christos of AMLL in 43 seconds and the second over Shayla Reynolds from WCAA in 26 seconds. Elora punched her second consecutive trip to the MSHSL state wrestling meet.

Anika Bostic (3-2) 100 - 5th

The story of the tournament for the Raiders was eighth-grader **Anika Bostic**. Entering the 100-pound bracket as the bottom-ranked 10th seed, the first-year wrestler shocked the field with her tenacity. Bostic's tournament highlight came in the consolation quarterfinals against Stella Gottschalk (DCL). Despite Gottschalk's impressive 21-4 record and a recent fourth-place state finish, Bostic utilized superior hand control and positioning to pull off a 4-1 upset victory. Bostic eventually battled back to the **5th Place Match**, where she pinned Lillian Bittner (PRIN) in 2:55. Her performance was so impressive that an opposing coach from AMLL expressed astonishment upon learning she was a first-year wrestler. For her grit and "upset of the tournament," Bostic was honored with the team's "**Wrestler of the Weekend**" award.
