Varsity: The Panthers opened the 2026 campaign with a 6-3 win over conference opponent Bertha-Hewitt Verndale. AJ Woodworth got the start on the mound and was relieved by Trevor Rounds. The Raiders were pesky enough hitters and did a good job squaring up a few on each Panther hurler. However, the veteran aces never faltered and continued to attack the zone. The defensive play of the night was a clean 4-6-3 double play from Grabow, to Woodworth to Skoglund to get us out of a jam in the 4th. Rounds led the offense with two singles and a double on the night. AJ Woodworth had a big single to score two, and Landen Nistler and Nolan Boesl both picked up their first career varsity hits and a pair of RBI each. Grabow rounded out the hitting attack and singled safely. Overall, it was great to be out on the diamond before we got back into hibernation with the snowy forecast.

JV: Panther JV started the season off with a 5-0 win over BHV. Colten Debilzen took the mound and went 4 strong innings giving up 3 hits, 1 walk and striking out 10 🧐🧐. This included getting out of a bases loaded jam in the first inning 🔥. Maddox Guenther finished the 5th walking 1 and striking out 2 🧐. Offensively, the boys took advantage of walks and miscues while tallying 6 hits 🍻 (Debilzen, Hoffman, Ruckheim, Becker, Goddard, Rud) while striking out 7 times 🧐 as the sun went down. It was a great night to shake off the rust and get the hard hats back on at the factory. 🏠

JH: The JH squad traveled to Bertha for a 2 game set today and despite very limited reps in practice the boys put together a solid outing in a rare March tilt. Game one saw a mixed squad with only four 8th graders available to start the game. The 4 inning contest would end in a 6-6 tie. The Raiders were bailed out when Eli Denny laced a bases loaded line drive to short, only to be snagged and then double off the runner at second. Isaiah Duberowski collected 4 RBI on the day going 2 for 3 with a double. Luke Schilling was 1 for 1 and worked a pair of walks and stole 3. Schilling took the mound for the first two innings scattering 3 runs, one earned. Gage Lind took over in the 3rd and was locating pitches, allowing one earned run before a line drive glanced off his forearm and out of safety he was given a rest. Duberowski came in and finished the game giving up 1 run while striking out 5 and walking one.

Game 2 started slow but the fellas opened up a hit parade in the final two stanzas, tallying 12 hits for the game en route to a 16-2 win. Parker Koep got the start and was solid over 2 innings allowing 2 runs while striking out 3. Koep also launched an RBI double at the plate. Phoenix Allen Lopez worked a 1-2-3 third including two Ks. He also had an RBI single as a pinch hitter. Jacob Toyli took care of the 4th and Toyli also added a pair of hits and a RBI. Birthday boy Kason Koep was 2 for 2 and Kaleb Uecker barreled it up 3 times collecting a pair of hits as well as 2 RBI. Also collecting RBI's today were Jett Bettin, Rylen Hendershot, Bentley Quick, and Dylan Marquette. Every player made a meaningful contribution today! A few small things to clean up with a short week as Mother Nature appears ready to send us back indoors for a while.
