Track Results: The Panthers competed against 12 teams in their second indoor meet of the season on Thursday, facing strong competition from schools across all three classes in Minnesota as well as North Dakota. Most events featured 60+ competitors.

Girls Highlights

Ella Boesl placed 13th in the 55M dash, 8th in the 200, and finished top 20 in both the long jump and triple jump. Natalie Schroeder took 14th in the 200M.

Nevaeh Koep was part of two top finishes, placing 9th in the long jump and helping the 4x800 relay team to a 2nd-place finish. She also placed top 20 in the 800M.

The distance group had a strong showing in the 1600, with Norah Froslee (2nd), Sophie Pfeffer (9th), and Kaylee Vogt (10th) all finishing in the top 10. The 4x800 relay team of Nevaeh Koep, Chloe Patrick, Norah Froslee, and Alexa Lego finished 2nd overall, just behind Moorhead. Chloe Patrick also placed top 20 in the triple jump.

The throwing group continued to impress, led by Lilly Gulbrandson with a 2nd-place finish. Kailey Hinrichs placed 11th and Alicia Penrose placed 20th. Rebekah Harstad had a strong meet as well, placing top 20 in the 55M hurdles and 10th in the high jump.

Solid performances across the board came from Vanessa Dorn, Bella Penrose, Maddie Fahlin, Katie Pexsa, Jaeda Porter, Izabella Vogt, and Olivia Christians, who competed well and finished in the top 40 in most of their events.

Boys Highlights

Brant Bak carried last week's strong performance into Thursday, placing 10th in the long jump, 12th in the high jump, and 14th in the 55M dash.

Zander Becker had an outstanding night with top-20 finishes in the 200M, 400M, and high jump. Ryker Springer ran a strong race to place 12th in the 200M, while Bode Wagner finished 11th in the 55M hurdles.

Other key contributors who put up impressive numbers included Aiden Moran, Christopher Becker, Zach Ruckheim, Jorge Martin-Pina, JD Leehy, and Luke Blomquist.

The throwing group put together a solid series, led by Wyatt Asleson (12th) and Zak Koep (17th), while Kyan Abernathy, Reese Kortenbusch, and Mathias Gulbrandson all placed in the top 45.

Austin Lucht and Bowen Schleis represented the distance group well, both finishing in the top 45.

Overall, it was a strong indoor meet and a great opportunity to compete against high-level competition. The Panthers look forward to getting outdoors and continuing to improve.
