Softball Results: The Lady Panthers take both games from BHV in season opener! The Panthers came out hot putting up four runs in the bottom of the first inning. BHV put across their only run in the 3rd after a double off the fence, then were blanked by the Panther defense for the rest of the game. Later they put up six in the fourth inning and one more in the fifth to seal the mercy rule with a score of 11-1. Offensively, Sydney Lorine led the offense with three hits while Henlee Mrnak, and Evy Grinager recorded two hits, and six other Panther batters had one hit at the plate. Sydney Lorine pitched all five innings, giving up one hit, and one run while fanning seven BHV batters.

Game two saw a little tighter game for three innings with a 3-1 game until the Panther offense came alive for five runs and tacked on one more ending the game at a score of 9-1. The Panthers had nine hits with Henlee Mrnak and Brooke Schilling leading the way with three hits each and combining for five RBIs. Lorine had two hits, and Bri Skoglund recorded one hit. Evy Grinager went the distance on the mound spreading seven hits over seven innings of work while striking out twelve. Well done ladies! Next up is Wadena/Deer Creek on Thursday at 4:30.

Baseball Results: PP 14; BHV 0

The Panthers started off the week with a 14-0 win over Bertha-Hewitt Verndale Monday. Trevor Rounds got the start on the mound and went the distance on just 60 pitches, giving up only 3 hits, no free passes and striking out 7 Raiders on his way to the win. His defense played clean behind him as Woodworth and Grabow gobbled up everything hit at them while our defensive play of the game came from the outfield. In the bottom of the third with a man on first and one out, a ball was hit to the shallow right center gap. Freshman Colton Deblizen tracked down the fly ball for out number two, then promptly fired a rope to Skoglund at first for the double play. Offensively Nistler led the charge going 3-3 on the day with 4 RBI. Nolan Boesl, Trevor Rounds and AJ Woodworth each added two apiece, while Ruckheim, G. Boesl, Grabow and Skoglund all hit safely for a total of 13 hits on the day.

JV picks up their 2nd win with a 5-0 win in 5 innings. The boys scored right away in the first inning behind a Holmquist single and tallied 4 more in the 4th with 4 hits. The JH home opener at the Factory brought in a familiar opponent as the Raiders of BHV came to town. It was more gritty than pretty but the boys played well enough to win both games. Isaiah Duberowski toed the rubber in game one but didn't have his command as the patient hitters worked walks en route to 3 first inning runs. Gage Lind was solid in relief going 3 scoreless giving way to Luke Schilling for the final stanza where the Raiders took advantage of a pair of errors to tie it up. Offensively the Panthers clawed away with one in the first and with aggressive base running plated 4 in the 2nd. A scoreless third for both teams had the score tied in the final frame Gage Lind worked a walk and Duberowski found redemption with a walk off single to center for the 6-5 win. Schilling paced the Panthers with a pair of hits and Jett Bettin, Eli Denny and Gage Lind all worked walks and ended up scoring important runs.

Game 2 was a route. Parker Koep was in control working three innings scattering 4 unearned runs and Rylen Hendershot closed it out with a Snapper Mow 'em down inning in the 4th. Offensively the boys were on the attack and took advantage of several defensive miscues adding timely hits and aggressive base running on their way to 13-4 victory with a mercy rule enforced. Nine different players scored in the game. Parker Koep and Eli Denny had a pair of hits each. Jett Bettin, Jacob Toyli, Elliot Arvidson, Dylan Marquette, Rylen Henderson, and Bentley Quick all hit safely in the game. Defense play of the game, nothing prettier than a 6-4-3 double play and Tolyi-Arvidson-Quick made it look easy.
