Track Results: The Parkers Prairie track and field teams had an outstanding meet with strong performances across the board. On the boys side, Ryker Springer led the way with a 1st place finish in the 200m and a 2nd place finish in the 400m, while also competing alongside teammates Brant Bak, Zander Becker, Aiden Moran, Zach Ruckheim, and Casey Hoemberg in the sprints. In distance events, Austin Lucht, Bowen Schleis, and Ty Buchholz turned in solid races in the 800m. The hurdles crew was dominant with Bode Wagner winning the 110m hurdles and JD Leehy taking 1st in the 300m hurdles, followed closely by Wagner and Carter Hoemberg.

Relay teams shined as well, with strong contributions from Jorge Martin-Pina, Chris Becker, Cristian Dorn, Luke Blomquist, and others across the 4x100, 4x200, 4x400, and 4x800 relays. In the field events, Wyatt Asleson and Zak Koep led the way in shot put and discus, with additional contributions from Kyan Abernathy, Reese Kortenbusch, and Mathias Gulbrandson. Brant Bak, Zander Becker, JD Leehy, and Bode Wagner all contributed in the jumps.

For the girls, Ella Boesl had a standout day with multiple 1st place finishes in the 100m, 200m, and triple jump, while Natalie Schroeder, Aubree Hoffman, Madisyn Fahlin, Katie Pexsa, and Hattie Truax added depth in the sprints. Chloe Patrick and Olivia Christians ran strong in the 400m, while Nevaeh Koep and Alexa Lego dominated the 800m. Distance success continued with Kaylee Vogt, Sophie Pfeffer, Payson Grinager, and Norah Froslee in the 1600m and 3200m.

Vanessa Dorn contributed in the hurdles, and relay teams featuring Fahlin, Tenley Westad, Hoffman, Pexsa, Schroeder, Rebekah Harstad, Dorn, Koep, Lego, and Patrick all performed well, including multiple first-place finishes. In the field events, Lilly Gulbrandson, Alicia Penrose, and Eliza Krueger competed in throws, while Koep, Boesl, Hoffman, Truax, and Dorn added strong performances in the jumps.

Overall, both the boys' and girls' teams won 1st place. The boys' team scored 197 points to the next-best 86, and the girls' team scored 183 to the next-best 115. Nice job, Panthers!
