Baseball: PP 7; NYM 6

Panthers Power past Eagles off the bat of Boesl Grand Slam

The Panthers opened up the week with a 7-6 win over conference opponent New York Mills at the Factory. Peyton Skoglund got the nod for his first career varsity start and pitched well keeping the Eagles off balance all game. They were able to tally 6 hits, one earned run while Skoglund struck out and walked a pair. New York Mills also cashed in on a few errors from the home team allowing them to creep back in this one. Skoglund was a FPS (First Pitch Strike) machine today hitting at an 85% clip which in turn allowed him to throw his pitches and induce weak contact. Our webgem today goes to AJ Woodworth with a play deep in the hole at short and an absolute missile across to Rounds at first for an out in the 3rd to get the leadoff man. Almost a tale of two games today, it was a real pitchers duel as the game was 2-1 going into the bottom of the 5th with the Eagle ace having a pretty good game. The tone of the game then changed as Skoglund drew a leadoff walk, which allowed us to put Merrick Hoffman on the bases as a courtesy runner. He was promptly bunted over with a nice SAC bunt by Hudson Truax. Nolan Boesl wasted no time as he ripped a single to score Hoffman and tie up the game. Ruckheim was then able to induce a walk, and was followed by a Rounds single to load the bases. A baulk then allowed us to score N. Boesl to go up 3-2. Nistler was then HBP during his at bat to load them up for Gavin Boesl. A pitching change then to face Gavin Boesl turned out to be good news for the home team as the second pitch he saw, Gavin hit a towering fly ball over the left field fence for the grand slam putting us up 7-2! We needed every bit of Boesl's blast as the Eagles fought and clawed back to within a run in the sixth inning. With the top of the order due up in the 7th, Trevor Rounds was called on to shut the door. Trevor didn't just shut it, he slammed it as he set the Eagles down 1-2-3 with a pair of strikeouts. A nice win at home against an always tough opponent to start the week.

JV: The JV walked off the Eagles 3-2 to start their week. Pitching duties were shared between Levi Ruckheim and Maddox Guenther. Levi had an excellent start going three solid innings striking out seven Eagles. Guenther was on in relief and wiggled out of a jam, but he and the defense never lost their heads. Defensive play of the game came from behind the plate when Logan Becker threw out a potential base stealer at second with a perfect toss! With the game tied 2-2, Colten Debilzen was our leadoff man in the bottom of the 5th. Already with a triple and double on the day, Debilzen wasted no time as he singled to get us the winning run on. He promptly stole second base for our runner in scoring position. The bunt attempt to push him to third was popped up, freezing Colton, but did allow Hoffman to reach. A good read on the pitcher allowed both boys the double steal setting up the winning run 90 feet away for Eli Holmquist who also had a double on the day. Eli found a pitch he liked a blasted a shot over the centerfielders head to score Debilzen for the walk off winner!

The JH squad made the trip to New York Mills and Russ Jacobson Field where the Eagles asked us to play a rare 9 inning tilt. It was a good day of baseball with a back and forth contest that was just waiting to break open but alas the timely hit eluded both teams and the game ended 8-8. With both teams needing to preserve pitching for 3 more far shots week, no extra innings were played.

Luke Schilling got the start and was in the groove once again, but some infield errors and a catcher interference call allowed the Eagles three unearned. Schilling would go four strong allowing 6 runs but only one earned while fanning five and walking five and generating weak contact with nothing getting out of the infield. Parker Koep worked the next 4 allowing 2 runs while striking out 10 and walking just one. Rylen Hendershot closed the door 1-2-3 in the bottom of the ninth.

On the day the Eagles only had three hits. Missed signs took away scoring opportunities and the young Panthers left far too many runners on. There were some fireworks. Down one in the top of the ninth Kason Koep came down to his last strike and laced a single to left to bring in Toyli with the tying run. Offensively, Jacob Toyli had a pair of hits and an RBI Kaleb Uecker, Parker Koep

also hit safely and both had RBI as did Lind and Duberowski. Tomorrow the boys head to Menahga for a pair. The 7th grade will play first. Thursday and Fridays games will be at the Factory in Parkers Prairie.

Parkers Prairie C Squad Track & Field Results

The Parkers Prairie Panthers C Squad track and field teams performed well in their first real C Squad Meet.

On the boys side, Bowen Schleis led the way with two first-place finishes, winning the 800 meters (2:45.6) and the 1600 meters (6:04.7). Bode Wagner also had an outstanding meet, taking first in the 100m hurdles (17.3) and winning both the long jump (15'3") and triple jump (33'10"). Cristian Dorn added a second-place finish in the triple jump, while Carter Hoemberg, Casey Hoemberg, and Remington Lien all contributed strong performances in the jumps.

In sprinting events, Reese Ahlbrecht and Luke Toyli competed well in the 100 meters, while Everett Uhde had a standout day with a third-place finish in the 200 meters and additional strong efforts in the 400 meters and hurdles. In the field events, Mathias Gulbrandson placed second in shot put, and Jaxson Zimmerman had solid finishes in both shot put and discus.

The boys relay teams also performed well, earning second place in both the 4x100 relay (Cristian Dorn, Carter Hoemberg, Casey Hoemberg, Remington Lien) and the 4x400 relay (Bode Wagner, Cristian Dorn, Carter Hoemberg, Remington Lien). The sprint medley relay team (Cristian Dorn, Casey Hoemberg, Bowen Schleis, Remington Lien) added a third-place finish.

On the girls side, several athletes posted strong performances. In the 100 meters, Tenley Westad, Katie Pexsa, and Reagan Pexsa all placed in the top five, while McKenna Schroeder added a personal best. Hattie Truax led the way in the 400 meters with a third-place finish and also placed second in the long jump.

Laila Schleis competed in multiple events, including the 200, 400, and 100m hurdles, where she placed third. In the field events, Eliza Krueger and Tenley Westad turned in strong performances in both shot put and discus.

The girls 4x100 relay team (McKenna Schroeder, Katie Pexsa, Hattie Truax, Reagan Pexsa) earned a second-place finish.
