Baseball Results: PP 7; Menahga 0 Woodworth tosses complete game shutout!

A beautiful night at The Factory and the Panthers were methodical in this one. AJ Woodworth got the start and went the distance tossing the complete game gem, shutting out the Braves while only allowing four hits, one walk and striking out seven. He got some help from his defense as twice our outfielders hustled to balls and hit the cuts to hold runners to a single instead of a double. Our web gem was a beautiful 5-4-3 double play in the fourth. Hudson Truax snagged a hot shot at third and fired a strike to a waiting Grabow at second. Adam battled the sun, but made the catch and turn and fired to Rounds at first, who made a dandy dig for out number two! 12 hits for the Panthers today with both Boels recording a pair, as well as Rounds, and Woodworth. Ruckheim, Grabow, Skoglund and Truax rounded out the offensive attack. Heads up baserunning, and being able to manufacture a few runs early before a crooked number in the sixth gave us some nice insurance headed to the final frame. Next up, USA with a 3:00 start in Upsala Thursday, and Friday in Pillager at 4:30.

JV - A back and forth affair in this one as the we jumped to a 1-0 lead to start, but that was short lived as Menahga tied it in the second, only to have us take a 2-1 lead in the bottom half. Again, Menahga tied the game in the top of the third, only to have us take the lead again in the bottom half. The Braves plated five in the top of the fourth, while we only answered with one in our half. Another two runs for Menahga in the top of the fifth to make it a 9-4 ballgame. The Panther bats responded in a big way as six Panthers crossed the plate for the 10-9 advantage. Some shut down pitching and defense in the top of the sixth held the Braves scoreless. The bottom of the sixth was insurance time for the Panthers as we were able to push five across for the 15-9 lead. One lone Brave would score in the top half, but that would be all as the JV walks away 15-10 winners. Eli Holmquist got the start on the mound, striking out five in his 3 innings of work. Owen Ahlbrecht came on in relief when Eli got close to pitch count. Carter Putnam relieved Ahlbrecht and struck out four in his two innings of work, and picked up the win for his efforts!

JH - The JH squad put together their most complete two game series of the season beating Menahga 13-6 and 10-6 respectively. Game one broke open with an 8 run third which was more than enough for Jett Bettin who worked effectively through three and Dylan Marquette who closed it out. The pitching combined to allow just one hit in the contest. Offensively Jett Bettin, Kason Koep, and Jacob Toyli each had a pair of hits and Parker Koep's 3 RBI led the team. Rylen Hendershot, Kaleb Uecker, and Elliot Arvidson all tallied hits as well.

In game 2 the boys hit and ran well and were too much for the Braves ace "Nine". Luke Schilling and Gage Lind were a one two punch with a pair of hits each. Parker Koep, Jacob Toyli, Gage Rud and Wyatt Olson hit safely as did Duberowski. Duberowski got the start and was effective over two giving up 3 runs one earned on two hits while fanning five and walking one. Gage Rud worked an effective third attacking the zone and Gage Lind shut the door in the fourth with the game ending on a beautiful relay as Wyatt Olson fired to Schilling who fired to Rud for the tag out at second. Next up Upsala Swanville at home on Thursday.

Track Results: The Panthers varsity track and field teams traveled to Long Prairie to face strong competition. Both the boys and girls teams did a great job, with the boys finishing in 3rd and the girls in 2nd.

On the boys' side, Ryker Springer led the sprint group with a 5th-place finish in the 100 meters (12.03) and another 5th-place finish in the 200 meters (24.40), both personal bests. Zander Becker added solid efforts in both races, placing 8th in the 100 (12.30) and 10th in the 200 (25.28), while Luke Blomquist finished 19th in the 100 meters. In the 400 meters, Aiden Moran recorded a personal best time of 1:01.05.

The Panthers excelled in the relays, with the 4x100 team of Brant Bak, Ryker Springer, Xavier Richardson, and Samuel Krueger earning a runner-up finish in 45.35. The 4x200 relay team (Chris Becker, Samuel Krueger, Xavier Richardson, Zach Ruckheim) placed third, as did the 4x400 relay team (Chris Becker, Samuel Krueger, Xavier Richardson, Martin-Pina Jorge).

Field events were a major strength for the boys. In shot put, Parkers Prairie swept the top three spots, led by Wyatt Asleson (1st, 38'4.75"), followed by Zak Koep (2nd, PR) and Kyan Abernathy (3rd, PR). In discus, Reese Kortenbusch claimed first place with a personal best throw of 112'1", while Wyatt Asleson placed second and Zak Koep finished sixth. Brant Bak had a standout day in the jumps, winning both the high jump (6'0") and long jump (20'4"), while Zander Becker added a 6th-place finish in high jump and 5th in long jump. Aiden Moran placed third in long jump, and Chris Becker took fourth in triple jump.

On the girls side, the Panthers were equally impressive, led by distance standout Norah Froslee, who won both the 800 meters (2:32.34) and the 1600 meters (5:26.07). In the 3200 meters, Kaylee Vogt captured first place with a personal best of 12:11.46, followed by Sophie Pfeffer, who placed second with a personal best of her own.

In the sprints, Ella Boesl led the way with a 4th-place finish in the 100 meters (13.44) and 5th in the 200 meters (28.41), both personal bests. Natalie Schroeder placed 7th in both races, while Madisyn Fahlin and Bella Penrose added depth in the sprint events. In the 400 meters, Nevaeh Koep placed third with a personal best time of 1:04.49, and Olivia Christians also set a personal best. Alexa Lego was entered but did not compete.

In the 800 meters, Chloe Patrick ran to a strong 4th-place finish behind Froslee. The 1600 meters also featured Izabella Vogt and Jaeda Porter, who both recorded personal bests.

In hurdles, Vanessa Dorn placed 4th in the 100m hurdles, while Gretta Gassman added a personal best performance.

The relay teams continued to perform well, highlighted by a NEW SCHOOL RECORD time in the 4x400 relay (Nevaeh Koep, Chloe Patrick, Alexa Lego, Norah Froslee) and a first-place finish in the 4x800 relay (Sophie Pfeffer, Nevaeh Koep, Chloe Patrick, Alexa Lego). The 4x100 team (Ella Boesl, Aunika Jones, Natalie Schroeder, Aubree Hoffman) placed fourth, and the 4x200 team (Aubree Hoffman, Madisyn Fahlin, Aunika Jones, Isabella Penrose) finished fifth.

In the field events, Lilly Gulbrandson placed third in shot put, while Eliza Krueger added a personal best. In discus, Alicia Penrose earned a third-place finish, with Natalie Schroeder and Eliza Krueger also competing. In the jumps, Nevaeh Koep, Ella Boesl, and Aubree Hoffman all placed in the long jump, while Chloe Patrick earned a runner-up finish in triple jump.
