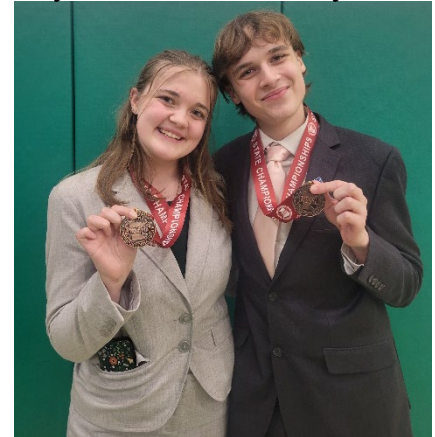

Softball Results: The Panthers Seek Revenge Against WDC

In a game nobody will be forgetting about soon, the Lady Panthers sealed the win in an epic battle against WDC in ten innings! Defense, pitching, and aggressive offense by both teams saw the game go into extra innings with a score of 5-5. WDC took a one run lead in the eighth inning, but an Elora Wagner double and Lily Steidl line drive stated that the Panthers weren't ready to end the game quite yet. Tied 6-6 going into the bottom of the tenth, the Panthers loaded the bases after reaching on a dropped third strike and an Amelia Van Batavia single that moved Evy Grinager to third (Van Batavia took second on the throw), WDC intentionally walked Autumn Hartman to load the bases. Skoglund torched an absolute laser up the gut, but it was snagged out of the air by the WDC shortstop. The Panthers gambled on a bunt with the bases loaded with one out. Lily Steidl executed a PERFECT bunt that the Wolverines couldn't do anything with other than turn and watch the winning run cross the plate sealing the win with a score of 7-6. Just two of the defensive highlights were a Bri Skoglund unassisted double play, and Sydney Lorine gunning down a Wolverine runner at home plate from left field. Every Panther played an important role in the victory. Evy Grinager got the start and battled through nine innings keeping the Panthers in the game and giving them a chance to take home the win. Grinager spread out ten hits and struck out four Wolverines. Sydney Lorine took the top of the tenth inning pitching a scoreless inning and striking out two WDC batters.

Rounds complete game shutout powers Panthers past the Huskies! A gritty performance on the mound from Trevor Rounds and shutdown defense behind him helped the boys to close out the week with a road win over Pillager. Rounds continued his domination this spring as he surrendered just 3 hits, 4 walks and 8 strikeouts on the day. His defense was flawless. Hudson Truax made the defensive play of the game as he backhanded a hot shot deep behind third base and showed off the arm as he rifled a strike to Skoglund at first. Not our best hitting night, we scored 2 runs in the first as both Rounds and Nistler had RBI singles to start things out. Unfortunately, we left the bases loaded twice this game as we struggled to find that hard hit ball in play with runners in scoring position. Going into the top of the seventh it was insurance time. With one out, Gavin Boesl blasted a double by the left fielder. Nistler hit a hard ground ball, but at the shortstop who was holding Boesl and the throw to first just beat him. With two down Woodworth hit a ground ball deep in the hole at short. As the shortstop wound to try and get Woodworth wheeling down the line, Gavin Boesl never broke strike, rounding third. AJ beat the throw at first and Boesl slid in safely at home. That brought Grabow up who hit a ground ball to third. The fielder's throw was up the line and Adam was able to duck under and reach and move Woodworth into scoring position. Peyton Skoglund then hit a hard ground ball to the second baseman. The ball wasn't fielded cleanly and as it was rolling around Woodworth who was running on contact was sent around third and by the time the second baseman corralled the ball and threw home, AJ was crossing the plate. Up 4-0 into the bottom half of 7th was more than enough cushion for Rounds and the defense to walk away 4-0 winners. Gavin Boesl led the charge as he was 2-3 on the day, while Nolan Boesl, Ruckheim, Rounds, Nistler and Woodworth all hit safely. Next up the boys travel to Sebeka Tuesday for a Park Region Conference clash, then we will host Frazee Thursday and OTC Friday.

JV: Panther JV gets their 3rd win of the week in a back and forth game with a tough Pillager Huskie team 12-9. The boys went up 2-0 in the first frame only to find themselves down 2-4 in the bottom by way of infield singles and walks. With 2 outs in the top of the second, Anders Fix kept the inning going with a walk which sparked the Panther offense to a 4 run inning while starting pitcher Carter Putnam struck out 3 getting out of a bases loaded jam in the bottom of the second. There was no scoring, albeit there being chances, until the Huskies put up 3 to take the lead 7-6 in the bottom of the 4th. Again, the Panthers put the ball in play and walked to stick another 3 runs on the board in the top of the 5th to make it 9-7. The Huskies singled and walked and with 2 outs laced a double to tie the game 9-9. The boys might need some ice after the top of the 6th as the Huskies plunked 5 Panthers hitters while also committing 2 errors allowing us to take a 12-9 lead. Merrick Hoffman shut the door in the bottom 2 frames to seal the win, throwing the last 4 innings, striking out 4, while Carter Putnam threw 3 innings and also struck out 4. Defensive plays of the game include Logan Becker throwing out a runner trying to steal 3rd in the late innings and Carter Putnam striking out 2 in a row with bases loaded which didn't allow any runs. #RollPanthers

This was game 7 and 8 on a long week meant keeping pitch counts down. Schilling and Duberowski each handled two innings and both guys worked the zone effectively with a 2:1 strike to ball ratio. Exactly what the coaching staff was looking for. Have to credit the Husky line up as they chipped away collecting 8 hits, all singles. Their ace threw hard and had command, but the Panthers kept after him. After leaving runners on 2nd and 3rd in the first and going down in order in the second the boys responded in the 3rd. Down 3-0 Schilling and Lind worked walks and Duberowski plated both with a triple to the gap. Parker Koep then executed the sac bunt to perfection, and it was all tied up. Unfortunately, the pesky Huskies added 3 State Farm insurance runs in the 4th and that meant it was time for the Cardiac Kids once again. Sure enough the boys rallied, mounted a threat, with Toyli, Bettin and Schilling all finding a way and we scored one but this time came up just short. Despite the loss, a lot of good things shined through in this one.

Game two broke open early with a 9 run first which was more than enough for Parker Koep who pitched a complete game. 1-9, every hitter reached base with Toyli pacing the team with a hit and 2 RBI. Bentley Quick had a day including a triple. Collectively the base running was sharp and aggressive. It was a great end to a long week of baseball and good things are in store for this group heading into the second half of the season. Next up is Sebeka at the factory on Tuesday.
