Baseball Results: PP 6; Sebeka 0

The Panthers welcomed Sebeka to the Factory on a very windy Tuesday. The Trojans, a solid team ranked inside the top five in QRF, are also the second place team in the Park Region Conference this season behind us. We jumped to an early 2-0 lead in the first sparked by a Nolan Boesl triple, followed by an Isaac Ruckhiem double to score Nolan. Ruck was moved to third by Rounds, then Boesl was HBP. A couple pitches later Boesl stole second and induced a pickle, and Ruckheim read the pitcher perfectly and as soon as he threw to try and get Gavin out, Isaac broke for home to score and give us the 2-0 lead early. Rounds got the start on the mound and was brilliant going the distance for the complete game shutout, giving up only four hits, two walks and striking out 10 of the potent Trojan batters! Our defense continued to shine and was highlighted by a double play today from the outfield. With the leadoff man on, and one out, Sebeka tried a hit and run. The ball was hit to Ruckheim in center, who was able to gather behind the ball, make the catch for out number two, then throw a strike to Skoglund waiting at first to double up the potential base stealer and get us back on offense! We were finally able to add insurance in the fifth as Truax reached on an error to lead things off. Debilzen then laid down a gorgeous bunt that walked the first base line fair and was able to reach without a play. With no outs, Nolan Boesl was tasked to lay a bunt down, but unfortunately was called out when he stepped out of the box on an inside pitch that he bunted, and both runners were sent back. With one out, Ruckheim battled at the plate and with two strikes hit a sharp ground ball up the middle too hot for anyone to handle to load the bases. With the bases loaded, Rounds wasted no time helping his cause when he doubled down the right field line on the first pitch he saw to clear the bags and put us up 5-0! Our final run came in the sixth when Debilzen singled to score Grabow with two outs for the 6-0 lead. Only seven total hits in this game for the Panthers against a good Sebeka pitcher. We made them count, relied on solid pitching and defense to edge out the Trojans in this one. Next up we head to Henning on Thursday to take on OTC, then close out the week and conference schedule under the lights in Menahga Friday.

JV continues their hot streak and getting some vengeance on Sebeka winning 14-4 in 5 innings. The Panthers started out hot offensively and put up 11 runs in the first 4 frames albeit leaving the bases loaded multiple times. Sebeka scored 4 in the top of the 5th to get within 7 off of some past balls and walks, but the Panthers had enough and put up 3 in the bottom frame to make it 14-4 and get home early. Holmquist was a home run shy of the cycle, going 3-4 with a single, double, and triple. Guenther, Ruckheim,

Becker, Goddard, Rud, and Putnam all collected a hit as well. The boys also waited for strikes as they walked 13 times. Guenther started on the mound, going 4.1 innings only giving up 2 hits, 2 walks, and striking out 9 while also collecting 3 pitching outs. Goddard and Ruckheim closed out the 5th with Levi striking out the final 2 batters. We look to continue our streak vs OTC and Menahga to end the week. #RollPanthers

JH - The 7th grade boys headed to Sebeka with a bad taste in their mouth from last Friday's loss. This would also be a rematch of a 1 run game from earlier this year. The Panthers responded in a huge way. The boys used 16 walks and 15 hits to pull away 22-0 in a mercy rule game. The offense saw every batter reach base at least twice. Elliott Arvidson and Jett Bettin each collected a pair of singles. Jacob Toyli got a hit and three RBI's, Parker Koep with a single, deep double and three RBI's, Kaleb Uecker with a hit and a rocket for a triple down the left field line. Kason Koep, Eli Denny, and Matthew Lehn all had singles to round out the attack. On the defensive side the locals had two errors but made a bunch of plays in the gusty winds. Arvidson started on the bump and cruised through three innings striking out five Trojan batters, walking one and allowing no hits. Rylen Hendershot took the fourth inning and sat one batter down himself while not allowing a hit. Headed into the bottom of the fifth Dylan Marquette toed the rubber and had a 1,2,3 inning with a pair of K's to complete the team no hitter. Was a great start to the week with a pair of home games to come.
