Softball Results: The Panthers hosted the Upsala Cardinals for the final game of the regular season. Much like the rest of the games this week, the Panthers put some tracks around the bases path, ending the game in the sixth inning with a 10-0 mercy rule victory. The Cardinals defense blanked the Panther offense in the bottom of the first inning, but the Panthers came into the bottom of the second ready to score as a walk, an error, and an Amelia Van Batavia single loaded the bases. Marisa Duberowski then smoked a double into left-center just out of reach of a Cardinal fielder, scoring two for the Panthers. Then Autumn Hartman laid down a beauty of a bunt, reaching first base and scoring Van Batavia. Sydney Lorine then hit a deep sacrifice fly to score Duberowski from third base, giving the Panthers a 4-0 lead. The bottom of the third saw a lead-off Evy Grinager walk. Then Alyssa Revering connected for a home run over the center field fence into the hands of some Panther fans, putting the Panthers up 6-0. Then, after a walk, a hit by pitch, and a fielder's choice, Sydney Lorine torched a line drive off the center field fence, clearing the bases, making it a 9-0 game. The bottom of the sixth saw Henlee Mrnak reaching on an error, Evy Grinager being hit by the pitch, and Alyssa Revering lacing a double into right-center, scoring the tenth run to seal the win for the Panthers. The offense was led by Amelia Van Batavia with three hits, Alyssa Revering with two, with Sydney Lorine and Marisa Duberowski adding one hit each. The Panther defense helped Alyssa Revering's cause in the circle. The defensive play of the game was in the top of the first when Brooke Schilling snatched a live drive going over her head, and fired over to Grinager at first for the inning-ending double play. Revering pitched all six innings, only needing 72 pitches to take home the win. Revering did a good job using the whole strike zone and mixing pitches, creating weak contact all game. Revering gave up only three hits, while striking out two Cardinal batters, securing the shutout. The Panthers finish their regular season with a 15-5 record, leading into Section 6A play next week. Baseball Results: PP 14; Menahga 6

Panthers close out the conference schedule undefeated! A night game in Menahga to close out the week and our conference schedule this season. JV got it done first with the 14-4 win in six innings. Levi Ruckheim got the start on the mound and was relieved by Eli Holmquist. The Panthers put up seven in the first, but the Braves crawled back in but eventually our JV was able to grow the lead and finish up an inning early.

With the JV playing first, a full dugout of players was welcome for this one tonight. In the varsity game, Skoglund got the start on the mound and went five innings and was relieved by Debilzen for two innings. Our defense struggled at times tonight on a few plays, and the pesky Menahga hitters were able to find some hits as they tallied eight total. Credit our pitchers for never losing their composure and continuing to attack the zone. After we scored a quick three runs in the first, Menahga battled and eventually we had a 3-2 ballgame going into the fifth inning where we broke it open and plated five. Another two in the sixth and four more in the seventh as the boys collected 10 hits tonight and worked four walks. AJ Woodworth had a day at the plate with two doubles and 4 RBI, while Nolan Boesl, and Grabow each had a pair of hits on the day. Ruckheim, Rounds and Truax all hit safely and Eli Holmquist in a pinch-hit situation lined the first pitch he saw into right field for his first career varsity hit. Even though our defense wasn't as crisp as we'd like, our athletes still found plenty of ways to erase Menahga runners tonight. Our first gem happened in the second with Menahga runners on first and second with no outs. A bunt popped well short of the mound. Skoglund went all out and made the running snag for out one, then planted his feet and threw a seed to Grabow at second to get that runner for out

number two, then Grabow threw a strike to Rounds at first to get that runner that couldn't get back in time-yes, a 1-4-3 triple play! In the fourth Debilzen showed off his arm as he threw a rope right on the money to second base to erase a potential base stealer. Then in the fifth, Gavin Boesl fielded a ground ball in left with the runner from second being waved around. Gavin hit his cut man Woodworth, then AJ showed off the arm, rifling the throw home to Debilzen for the tag out. Finally in the sixth, a dandy 5-4-3 double play from Truax, to Grabow to Rounds to end that inning. The Panthers look to wrap up the regular season this week with a pair of section matchups at Evansville Tuesday and home against Browerville Thursday.

The 7th grade boys looked to keep the good times rolling after Tuesday's big win against Sebeka. This afternoon they took on Nimrod's other suburb of Menahga. The boys put together patience at the plate, 11 walks, plus timely hitting, 12 hits, and some hard hit balls for errors to the tune of 16 runs. Elliot Arvidson piled up 3 singles in the game. Parker Koep and Eli Denny had a pair of hits. Jett Bettin, Jacob Toyli, Dylan Marquette, and Kason Koep each hit safely. Bentley Quick connected for a 2 RBI double as well. The Panthers jumped on the Braves early with 5 in the first and 6 in the second. The locals cooled in the third but were up 11-2 after 3. The fourth inning saw the Braves try and mount a comeback plating 4 runs. The boys responded with 5 of their own in the bottom half and pushed the score to 16-6. A clean 1,2,3 in the top of the fifth saw the Panthers head home early with the mercy rule. Two more games to finish up the spring season.
