Baseball: PP 28; Osakis 7

The Panthers opened their four game week with a road trip to Osakis and came away 28-7 winners. A much different feel this week as we tallied 16 hits as a team and did a much better job squaring up the baseball in favorable counts. A near clean game defensively, and our web gem was the one that ended it in the bottom of the 5th as we turned a nice 4-6-3 (Grabow, Woodworth, Rounds) double play. Hudson Truax got the start on the mound and was relieved by Nolan Boesl and Colton Debilzen. With it being the first time on the mound in a game this year for Truax and Boesl, it was a good opportunity for them to get work in. Debilzen came in for the final three frames and made quick work of the Silverstreaks as he threw strikes, let our defense work and got our guys back in the dugout and out of the wind. Osakis had a short 1-0 lead after the first, but steady at bats, good hits, and a bases clearing triple by Isaac Ruckheim in the first got the Panthers off and running and when the dust settled we were up 9-1. Credit Osakis for clawing back in their half of the second where they brought the score to 9-7. We would tack on another eight runs in the third thanks to walks, errors, good baserunning and a couple timely hits including a bases clearing double by Rounds who went 3-4 on the day with 5 RBI. Woodworth also had a 3 hit day at the plate while Nolan Boesl, Ruckheim, and Truax each had a pair of hits, while all other starters hit safely.
