Baseball Results: PP 11 USA 0 The Panthers hit the road for a rare Wednesday afternoon matinee and took care of business in five innings winning 11-0 over USA. Rounds was a beast on the mound tossing the complete game two hitter shutting out the Patriots and setting down nine batters via strikeout. His defense played excellent behind him making some dandy plays along the way. Grabow got the first gem of the game with a dandy backhanded pick at second then a fire to Skoglund at first. Then in the second, Truax got in on the action as he charged a little dribbler to third, scooped and fired a rope to Skoglund at first. Then in the fourth, Skoglund made his own gem as he made a difficult running catch in foul territory at first. Our outfield didn't get a lot of action but when they did they hustled everything in and we had two near outs from our outfield firing seeds to our infielders and cut men. Even though the temp was cold, our bats were red hot as we plated six men in the first inning, highlighted with hard hit balls by G. Boesl, a perfect SAC bunt by Grabow that he reached on, and singles by Skoglund and Truax and hustle baserunning. Ten total hits today, four free passes worked and only two strikeouts. Rounds, G. Boesl, and Grabow each had a pair of hits, while Woodworth, Skoglund, Truax and Debilzen hit safely. Truax had 3 RBI to lead all hitters. Stat of the week so far; 114 plate appearances in three games, only 5 strikeouts. Boys are looking to put the ball in play! A well earned practice today then we close out the week with a trip to New York Mills.

Softball Results: Game One: The Eagles had their talons out at the plate in the top of the first scoring four runs on four hits with a little help from a hit by pitch and a walk issued by Sydney Lorine. The big inning was silenced by a line drive double play caught by Henlee Mrnak, and a quick throw back to first. Lorine locked in and wouldn't allow another run until the top of the fourth. The Panthers got on the board after Amelia Van Batavia drew a walk and was eventually driven in on a Sydney Lorine single. The Panther bats came alive in the bottom of the fifth after back to back doubles by Evy Grinager and Alyssa Revering. Revering was pushed across the plate by an Amelia Van Batavia single putting the score at 5-3 and the Panthers picking at the lead. A few walks and fielder's choice allowed two more Eagles to cross the plate. That was enough to silence the Panthers ending the game 7-3 in favor of the Eagles. The Panthers out hit the Eagles eight to six, but the Eagles took advantage of a few Panther mistakes throughout the game. Lorine had two hits with Evy Grinager, Anna Helling, Alyssa Revering, Brooke Schilling, Lily Steidl, and Amelia Van Batavia all adding one hit a piece. Amelia Van Batavia did her job behind the plate, throwing out several Eagles trying to take bases from the Panthers in the contest. Lorine took her first loss of the season giving up seven runs on six hits while striking out four Eagle batters through seven innings.

Game Two: The Lady Panthers didn't let the first game dictate the outcome of the second game. The Ladies came out scoring two runs on two singles and taking advantage of a couple walks and an Eagle error. The Panthers added one to the scoreboard after Evy Grinager laced a single to center and eventually crossed the plate on a wild pitch. In the top of the fourth, with two outs, five consecutive hits by Lorine, Schilling, Mrnak, Grinager, and Revering added two more on the good gals side of the score board making it a 6-0 game. NYM did not give the Panthers any time to relax as they took advantage of a couple walks and an error to make the game 6-3. However, the Panthers had an answer as Elora Wagner drew a lead off walk with Lily Steidl once again laying down a "B.E.A.UTIFUL" sacrifice bunt that allowed Wagner to make it to third base on the play. Wagner would be hit in on an

Eagle error that was just a little too hard to handle from Anna Helling. Lorine and Schilling singles would also aid in two more making it a 9-3 game. NYM would put one more on the board later in the game, but the Panthers would pick up the win in game two on the chilly evening. The hitting attack was led by Sydney Lorine with three hits. Evy Grinager, Henlee Mrnak, Alyssa Revering, and Brooke Schilling all had two hits, with Anna Helling and Amelia Van Batavia chipping in with one hit a piece making a total of thirteen hits for the Panthers! Alyssa Revering picked up another win in her second start of the year. Revering put everything into her pitching performance tonight giving up four runs on three hits with four strikeouts. The Panther defense did a nice job and was highlighted by a Lily Steidl catch in right field leaping into the fence on a deep fly ball. Evy Grinager added in the defensive fun with a diving catch in center field.

Panthers JV Softball won 8-7 against New York Mills. Whitney Weber tossed the game. After a slow start in the first inning it was nice to see the bats wake up in the second inning. Brynn lead the offense with 2 Doubles. One being the game winner getting the walk offs RBIs in the 5th inning. Grace, Ady, Mya, Whitney, Abi, & Joanna all picked up one hit in the game.
